ensure you get the pay rise you deserve. Because no one in the NHS should be on low wages. You are worth so much more than that.

Outsourcing of services has made everything more complicated. It would be so much fairer and more efficient for everyone who works in the health service, whoever they are employed by, to be on Agenda for Change (NHS)

terms and conditions. So now more than ever we will continue our campaign for that to be the case.

## Health contractor staff in UNISON

UNISON believes that our contractor members in health should be paid a fair wage for the jobs they do – getting the same rates and benefits as their directly employed NHS colleagues.

This includes members working for private companies, social enterprises and wholly owned subsidiary companies (subcos). As a result of outsourcing and marketisation of NHS services we have staff working for a variety of non-NHS employers including hospital cleaners, catering and housekeeping staff, porters and security staff, clinical staff and many more.

You and your colleagues are eligible to join UNISON and play a full part in health branches, the health service group and at every level of the union. Joining the union is not just about protection if someone is having problems at work, but includes other work that we do, such as education and training plus membership benefits like legal assistance, financial assistance and special deals through UNISONplus.

We also have a national network of private contractor reps who meet regularly to plan and oversee how we work to improve pay and conditions in companies delivering public services.

Organised workplaces with high levels of union membership mean that UNISON has much greater influence with local managers and with employers.

This gives members a stronger sense of confidence and ability to change things, together with much higher chances of winning full union recognition.
